Blackmore Wagyu Beef has access to the only Mishima bull to ever leave Japan. The bull named Wakakusa, is the 'father' of the Blackmore Mishima herd.

David Blackmore has started with 3 base bloodlines developed from Wagyu, Angus and Lowline and after 6 generations, will be able to stabilize a new breed in Australia.

The superior working stamina of Mishima, gives the breed the ability to store energy in the form of marbling. This unbelievable marbling and strength makes them ideal to produce beef from grass, producing beef very distinctive from other grass fed cattle and different flavours from grain fed Japanese Wagyu.

Mishima cattle are the original native cattle of Japan, having been designated a natural monument in 1928. They are reserved on the small island of Mishima in the Sea of Japan.

Mishima cattle are classified as late maturing cattle with dark brown coat colour and small horns, as well as a narrower body compared to modern Japanese Wagyu. They have a delicate appearance including their face.

The average dimensions of a mature Mishima female (60 months old) are; Withers height: 112.8 cm, Chest girth: 152.1 cm, and Body weight: 261.1 kg.
